

This famous Aristotle quote certainly holds true as we reflect on our past year. When individual parts are connected to form one entity, they are worth more than if the parts were in silos. The team at Central Susquehanna Community Foundation (CSCF) has come to appreciate that the Foundation is greater in its success because of the sum of its parts. Without board members, affiliate board members, fundholders, donors, grantees, and Foundation friends, we could not have had the remarkable year that we are so proud to highlight in this 2018 edition of our annual report:

- We are working with a new affiliate. Welcome aboard Bloomsburg Area Community Foundation! We are excited to announce this new partnership as we unite with their advisory committee to enhance the lives of the people who are served in the greater Bloomsburg area.
- Regional unrestricted giving fulfills the Foundation's mission of enhancing the quality of life across the valley. We held our first regional Impact Symposium this past June at Bucknell University, which provided an opportunity to bring more than 120 representatives from nonprofit agencies together to network, learn, collaborate, and provide take-away benefits of new ideas, strategies, connections, and resources. Taking the lead on this special convention expanded our role to nonprofit organizations in our region who are working so hard to make a difference for so many important causes.
- In addition, CSCF introduced its first grantround for the Regional Impact Fund to meet the ever-changing needs across the five and one-half counties that we serve. Through this unrestricted fund, the Foundation was able to award \$50,000 to 11 nonprofit organizations with amounts ranging from \$1,000 to \$10,000.
- We have made phenomenal strides launching our first giving circle. The Women's Giving Circle hosted their first grant awards ceremony this past March in Lewisburg where we presented \$20,000 to local nonprofit

organizations supporting women and girls through our region. These grants are helping agencies whose primary role is to reduce domestic violence, advocate for girls and teens in the child welfare dependency system, enhance enrichment and self-advocacy programs for women, and encourage safe dating, just to name a few.

Youth in Philanthropy (YIP) continues to grow and expand. Eight schools were involved this year and more will be added in the near future. The meaning of philanthropy and the opportunity to participate in grantmaking is the focus of this program. Last year, each school created their own video which was housed on our website and school teams were prompted with the opportunity to solicit votes for best video. This was an extraordinary opportunity presented to our students to promote youth in philanthropy and provide a resource to the public.

On the evening of our holiday party, the staff of Central Susquehanna Community Foundation announced that we are officially 20 years old. The very first meeting of what was then the Berwick Health & Wellness Foundation occurred in November 1998. At the end of 2018 we began the celebration of 20 years of philanthropy - 20 years of investing into the many wonderful communities that our Foundation represents, encompassing the goal of improving and enriching the lives of those we care most about.

Thank you for being the catalysts in helping us to be stronger over the last 20 years. Celebrating is a good thing for us to do; it helps us to realize how good we have it, and it helps others discover who we are.

In partnership with Bloomsburg University's Regional STEM Education Center, Martz Technologies, Bloomsburg Fair Association, and the Foundation of the Columbia-Montour Chamber of Commerce, the Central

Susquehanna Community Foundation hosted the 2nd Annual Bloomsburg Fair Regional STEM Competition in September 2018.

The theme of this year's competition was "Energy and Efficiency in the Community". High schools across the region were eligible to compete for three prizes; 1st place prize of \$10,000, 2nd place prize of \$5,000, and \$2,500 for third place. These prizes were made payable in the form of grants to support the school district's STEM program. Each school district was allowed one team of five students. Students researched, designed and presented a project that was capable of improving the quality of life for Pennsylvanians through the incorporation of efficient energy use. Projects were exhibited in the Technology Building at the Bloomsburg Fair. September 22-28. Students presented their projects to a panel of distinguished judges from industries and academia.

The list of schools competing in this year's event included Berwick Area High School. Central Columbia High School, Midd-West High School, Montgomery Area High School and Shikellamy Area High School.

BENEFITING YOUTH THROUGH ESTATE GIVING WITH THE GARMAN FAMILY FUNDS

A former Snyder County couple, Patricia H. and Richard E. Garman, made the thoughtful decision to leave an estate gift to benefit youth in the community where they were born and raised. Their experiences, successful careers, and giving nature, led them to this decision. They were a couple who truly believed in giving their time, knowledge, and financial support to numerous organizations, and did so in an ever-quiet manner. Richard enlisted in the United States Marine Corps immediately after graduating from Selinsgrove High School and married Patricia Hetherington after returning from the war. He attended Bucknell University and was honored with the Distinguished Engineering Alumni Award in 2005 and an honorary Doctorate in 2007. Richard was the owner of several companies and firms in Buffalo, NY.

Our Regional Impact Fund is addressing a *broad range of local needs* across our 5 ½ county footprint. The flexibility of this unrestricted fund lets the Foundation respond to the community's most pressing needs today and tomorrow. Hosting our *first regional Impact Symposium* last June helped us focus on this goal. More than 120 representatives from nonprofit organizations participated. 

YOUTH IN PHILANTHROPY

Central Susquehanna Community Foundation's Youth in Philanthropy program, known as YiP, provides high school students across the Central Susquehanna region an opportunity to learn about philanthropy and participate in the grantmaking process. Focused on the meaning of philanthropy and the importance of getting involved, the YiP program allows students to gain experience in teamwork, assessment of community needs, building consensus, nonprofit finance and the local nonprofit world.

In partnership with faculty liaisons at local school districts, students in grades 9 through 12 volunteer to form YiP groups. Throughout the year, each group researches school-based and community needs and strengths, while exercising their leadership and decision-making skills. Contributions from generous community members allow each group to award up to \$5,000 annually in grants to nonprofit organizations for youth programs. Students create a plan to survey their community to develop criteria to prioritize their grant awards.

Corresponding with the academic calendar, the YiP program meets twice per vear for day-long workshops hosted by the Foundation. In addition, school groups meet monthly at their school. To celebrate community impact, the YiP program hosts a grant presentation ceremony annually in April.
